Planned course results:	<p>In accordance with the Order of the Ministry of Education and Science of the Russian Federation d.d. 03.10.2014 No. 1304 "On approval of requirements for the development of additional general education programmes those provide training for foreign citizens and stateless persons to develop professional educational programmes in Russian", as a result of studying an additional general education programme on the Russian language, the listener should:</p> <p>know:</p> <p>scientific terminology in the framework of the course; the subject and significance of historical science; Russian history division into periods: establishment and development of the old Russian state (IX - XII century), the feudal fragmentation in Russia (XIII - XV centuries), the unification of the Russian principalities into a single state, the expansion of Russian lands (second half XV - XVII centuries), the Russian Empire (XVIII - beginning of XX centuries), Soviet state (1917 - 1991), modern Russia (early 90-es of the XX century - now); basic processes, phenomena and events in various periods of Russian history; the prominent Russian/Soviet leaders and their role in the development of the state; Russia's place among world civilizations; the names and geographical location of the areas annexed by the state in various historical periods; the location of settlements and areas where important historical events took place; geographical location of the countries with which Russia maintained a cooperative association ;</p> <p>be able to:</p> <p>use the terminology of the course; explain what history examines</p>

	and its significance; relate historical events with corresponding periods of the Russian history; characterize the main events of the Russian history; reveal causal relationships between facts, events, and processes; analyze historical phenomena; describe the position of Russia in the system of world civilizations; show on the historical map: the boundaries of the state and the city, played a leading role in different historical periods, areas where the most important Russian historical events took place, countries with which Russia maintained a cooperative association.

The course purpose	To provide general education in mathematics for successful studying professional educational programmes in the Russian language.

Planned course results:	<p>In accordance with the Order of the Ministry of Education and Science of the Russian Federation d.d. 03.10.2014 No. 1304 "On approval of requirements for the development of additional general education programmes those provide training for foreign citizens and stateless persons to develop professional educational programmes in Russian", as a result of studying an additional general education programme on mathematics, the listener should:</p> <p><b>know:</b>  theorems, rules and formulae, which express the basic relation of elementary mathematics; elements of set theory, numerical sets; computing and identity transformation methods of mathematical expressions; solution and study methods of the main types of equations and inequations, systems of equations and inequations; definitions, graphs and properties of elementary functions; coordinate method, methods of research the basic properties and graphing of functions; basic concepts of mathematical analysis: the limit of sequence and function, derivative, primitive, integral; operations on vector in geometric and coordinate forms; definitions (descriptions) of basic concepts of elementary mathematics, mathematical analysis;</p> <p><b>be able to:</b>  formulate and prove theorems studied in the course, formulate rules, derive the basic formulas of elementary mathematics; use the symbols of set theory; perform operations of union and intersection of number sets; perform calculations, identical transformations of expressions, take the logarithm and raise algebraic expressions; solve linear, quadratic, rational, exponential, logarithmic and trigonometric equations; analyze solutions of linear and quadratic equations; solve linear and quadratic inequations, solve inequations by the method of intervals, inequations with indeterminate under the modulus sign, exponential, logarithmic and simple trigonometric inequations; solve systems of two linear equations with two indeterminates;</p>

	analyze solving systems of linear equations with two variables; solve systems of nonlinear equations; solve systems of inequations; explore the basic properties of elementary functions; plot graphs of elementary functions and perform simple transformations of graphs; identify properties of functions according to their graphs; find the limits of sequences, limits of functions, derivatives and integrals; analyze functions using the derivative; solve problems involving arithmetic and geometric progressions; perform operations with vectors in geometric and coordinate form; use mathematical terminology and symbols; formulate problem statements, explain and record the solution, using subject terms, symbols and natural language; define (or give description) basic concepts of the studied sections of elementary mathematics, and mathematical analysis.
